Dermoscopy in Stockport

Primary Care Dermatology Services have been reformed in Stockport due to a programme of training GPs in dermoscopy and equipping every GP surgery with at least one dermoscope. This has resulted in a deflection of unnecessary onward referrals, meaning the consultants in secondary care settings are only seeing patients who genuinely need their expertise. Karen will explain how this has been achieved
