

Database of Private Hospitals

Private hospitals in the UK provide medical services to patients outside of the NHS structure. They are normally owned by a private or a non-for-profit organisation and offer healthcare privately funded by either patients themselves or by insurance companies. Personnel working in private healthcare may either work exclusively at one or more private hospitals or split their time with across both private and NHS care. In the UK, £1.4 million is spent on hospice care every day, part funded by the government with the remainder coming from local fundraising.
